Address for registration – Can someone without a permanent address use a service organization (for example, the YAPC office, a shelter, or drop-in) as their voting address? If so, is there a specific form or documentation required to confirm that address?

Yes. Elections Yukon provides a method for voters without a fixed residential address to provide proof of address in the form of an attestation called:

Form 348 — Attestation For Electors Without Proof of Residence and or With No Fixed Address.

Proof of ID or vouching – If a person doesn't have formal ID, can a staff person from an organization (such as a shelter or outreach worker) vouch for them? And if so, is there a specific form or process we should be aware of?

Vouching is possible on Election Day at the polls. This is when a registered elector vouches for another confirming both their identity and their provided address.

A registered elector may only vouch for one person at the polls, and they must be present to do so.

They will be supported through this process by an Election Officer.

Information access and outreach – Is this information currently available on the Elections Yukon website, and will there be outreach to frontline organizations to ensure they know how to support clients who are unhoused to vote?

Elections Yukon continues to collaborate with our local community organizations to engage and provide accessible information to support electors with participating in the election. This includes plentiful online resources at <u>ElectionsYukon.ca</u>, working with stakeholder teams regarding the plebiscite and its promotional content, this current initiative with YAPC, as well as virtual town hall meetings, and engaging forums.

The next virtual town hall meeting will take place on **Oct 23, 2025 @ 7:00pm**. This will be a public information session and include time for Q/As. Following that, another will be hosted on **Oct 30, 2025** with a time yet to be finalized.
